Margaret Arnold serves as Head of Secretariat for the ProVention Consortium, a partnership launched by the World Bank in 2000 and currently hosted by the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) in Geneva. Prior to joining ProVention in 2007, Margaret was at the World Bank, where she worked on urban development, post-conflict reconstruction, and natural disaster risk management since 1995. She was part of a two-person team that established the Bank's Hazard Risk Management Team in 1998 (formerly called the Disaster Management Facility), and is credited with facilitating the Bank's recognition of disaster risk reduction as a development priority. She provided technical support to the Bank's disaster response and recovery operations, helped to develop a portfolio of disaster risk management projects, and led the development of a disaster risk management training program for Bank staff and clients. Her publications include *Natural Disaster Hotspots: A Global Risk Analysis* (2005); *Learning Lessons from Disaster Recovery: the Case of Honduras* (2004); "Disaster Reconstruction and Risk Management for Poverty Reduction" (*Journal of International Affairs*, Spring/Summer 2006, vol. 59, no. 2, Columbia University), *Building Safer Cities* (2003, co-editor) and *Managing Disaster Risk in Emerging Economies* (2000, co-editor), *Managing Disaster Risk in Mexico* (1999); and *The World Bank's Experience with Post-Conflict Reconstruction* (2000).
