'Marieke Wierda, the Director of the Prosecutions Program at the International Center for Transitional Justice, is a Dutch citizen born and raised in Yemen. Educated in the UK (LL.B., Edinburgh University) and United States (LL.M., NYU and member of the New York Bar), Ms. Wierda is specialized in international criminal law. She spent 3 years with the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia in its early years (1997-2000) as an associate legal officer. Since that, at ICTJ she has focused on the Special Court for Sierra Leone, the ICC intervention in Uganda, the monitoring of the Saddam Hussein trial in Iraq, and the Special Tribunal for Lebanon and its impact in Lebanon (where she is currently based). She has also worked on general transitional justice issues in Afghanistan, Sudan, and Liberia. Ms. Wierda is widely published, including co-authoring a book on International Criminal Evidence and numerous articles on international criminal justice and transitional justice.
